Ways to Get Helpful Early Feedback




Whether you've thought about having others provide input on your work or not, it's an important step to consider. For one thing, there are tens of thousands of new books coming out each year, and the quality of your writings can help in standing out from the crowd. It can also be reassuring to hear that your main protagonist is compelling, that side plot about your Uncle Joe's time in the military is dragging down a memoir's pace, and more.

By coming up with a specific list of questions for alpha or beta readers, and considering other aspects of the who, when, and how of asking for feedback, writers can gain a clearer sense of how to move their work forward.

Punctuation Perspective

Using an occasional punctuation option beyond commas and periods can help spice up sentences, better convey how sentence elements connect, and benefit tone and the flow of content. But overuse of such punctuation, such as strings of question marks and exclamation points to add energy, suggests a writer who hasn't fully mastered their craft.
